

## DESCENDANTS OF DAVID(1)HAYS - SECOND GENERATION

1. THOMAS(2)HAYS(DAVID 1) was born in 1745 or 46. According to the 1880 census records of two of his sons, he was born in N.J.. He m. 1st Mary \_\_\_\_\_ (d.1790). In the Washington Co., Pa. census of 1790, there were two males age 16 or over, 3 males under 16, and two females. These would be Thomas and his first wife and their unmarried children. He m. 2nd the widow Elizabeth Kerr. (She was living in 1828 and was perhaps the Elizabeth Clifford Hays reported to be buried at Cross Creek, Pa.) He was Ruling Elder of Racoon Presbyterian Church, Candor, Pa. in 1792, he inherited 200a. of land in Smith and Mt. Pleasant twps., Washington Co., Pa. He was living on the land at that time and it was described as adjoining that of Lund Washington. Thomas d. Apr.9,1828 in Smith twp., and is buried at Cross Creek, Pa. He is reported to have had 20 children, but only 12 are mentioned in his will. His tombstone says he was a soldier of the Revolution and early D.A.R. lines state that he served as a soldier from N.J. and that when the colony was overrun by Indians and Tories, his family took refuge in a fort near Big Meadows and his wife moulded bullets.
2. PRUDENCE(2)HAYS(DAVID 1) may have been the oldest daughter, as she inherited "bed and bedding" in addition to 75 pounds. She may have married William Gordon. She was living in 1792.
3. JAMES(2)HAYS(DAVID 1) Probably served in the Revolutionary War and was on list of Cap't Archibald Shaw's Co., Sussex Co. militia, mustered Dec. 25,1775. Was living in 1792 when his father's will was written. He inherited 130a. of land, it being the lowest improvement his father had on Racoon Creek. He sold this land on Apr. 4, 1797. In the deed, his wife's name is given as Elizabeth. We have no further trace of this James.
4. ELENOR(2)HAYS(DAVID 1) Living in 1792.
5. JOHN(2)HAYS(DAVID 1) Served in Revolutionary War. Private in Capt. Bond's Co., 4th reg't, N.J. Continental line. Enlisted in Sussex Co., Apr.6,1777; promoted Ensign in Capt. Anderson's Co., 4th reg't, N.J. Continental line, June 1, 1777; transferred to Capt. Forman's Co., 4th reg't, N.J. Cont. line; d. Nov. 3, 1777 of wounds received at the battle of Germantown, Oct.4,1777.
6. ANN(2)HAYS(DAVID 1) Living in 1792.
7. DAVID(2)HAYS(DAVID 1) b.Feb.15,1753 in N.J. Served in Rev. War as private, 1st Reg't Sussex Co. militia - monthly tours under Capts. Mills and Mellick in 1775 and 1776, Col. Mark Thomson. in 1777 lived Northumberland Co., Pa. and served in Capt. James Thompson's Co., Col. Hugh White; appointed Wagonmaster, Wagonmaster General's Dept., N.J. militia, May 18, 1778; served as Capt., conductor of Team Brigades under Col. Jacob West. m. Hannah Van Wye. Lived Smith twp., Washington Co., Pa. in 1790. Had three sons and one daughter then. Inherited land there in 1792 and sold it on June 27, 1797. Lived Green twp., Beaver Co., Pa. in 1820. d. there 1836 or 37. (Letters of Adm. issued to son John, March 7,1837.)
8. ELIZABETH(2)HAYS(DAVID 1) Living in 1792. May be the Elizabeth Hays who m. John Lyle.
9. MOSES(2)HAYS(DAVID1) b.Nov.17,1760,Greenwich twp., Sussex Co., N.J.(now Warren Co.) In Revolution - enlisted Aug.1776 and served 1 mo. in Capt. Mellick's Co., Col. West's N.J. reg't; in 1778 served 2 mos. as teamster under Quartermaster David Hays and Cols. West and Hooper; served 2 yrs. as

blacksmith under George Newton; in 1781, 6 mos. in Capt. Winter's Co., Col. West's reg't guarding the frontiers from Indians and Tories. m. about 1783, Jemimah Peterson (b. Oct. 2, 1765 - d. July 10, 1837). They moved to Washington Co., Pa. about 1785. Lived there in Smith twp. in 1790. Member of Racoon Presb. Church, Candor, Pa. Blacksmith and farmer. d. Aug. 4, 1837 in Smith twp. Both buried at Cross Creek, Pa. Eleven children.

10. MARY(2)HAYS(DAVID 1) Living in 1792.

11. JOSEPH H.(2)HAYS(DAVID 1) b. Nov. 13, 1763 in Greenwich twp., Sussex Co., N.J. (Now Warren Co.) In Revolution. Private in Capt. James Bonnell's Co., N.J. State Troops and stationed on the frontiers of Sussex Co.; served from April 1, 1782 to Dec. 15, 1782. In 1790 he lived in Smith twp., Washington Co., Pa. with his wife, Anna, and family. Moved to Washington, Mason Co., Ky. in 1795; moved near Cincinnati, Ohio in 1797 and to Clear Creek twp., Warren Co., Ohio in 1798. d. April 15, 1846 in Clear Creek twp. Buried Ridgeville Presb. Church Graveyard. Removed to Miami Cem., Corwin (Waynesville), Ohio in 1870. Five sons and one daughter.

12. WILLIAM(2)HAYS(DAVID 1) b. Sept. 8, 1765, Greenwich twp., Sussex Co., N.J. Lived in Smith twp., Washington Co., Pa. in 1790 with wife Jean and family. Inherited land there with bro. Andrew, in 1792. Sold the land May 2, 1794. Settled first in Ohio with the Muskingum settlers. m. 2nd on March 7, 1810, near Hamilton, Butler Co., Ohio, Sarah Fleming (b. July 28, 1792 - d. Feb. 28, 1881). Served in the War of 1812 - Private in 14th reg't of Ohio infantry. Lived in Greenville twp., Darke Co., Ohio in 1820 and 1830. Moved near Waynetown, Montgomery Co., Ind. and then to Champaign Co., Ill. d. there Jan. 2, 1852. Children by both wives.

13. ANDREW(2)HAYS(DAVID 1) It is difficult to determine his birth year. It was 1766, 67 or 68. The 1850 census states that he was 84, but two different applications for bounty land that he was 82 in 1850 and 88 in 1855. He was born in Greenwich twp., Sussex Co., N.J. He m. Mary ("Polly") Fulton (b. ca. 1864 in Md.). In 1790 he was living in Smith twp., Washington Co., Pa. with wife and family. He inherited land there jointly with his bro., Wm. in 1792. He sold his half of this land on Dec. 1, 1794 and moved to Ohio before 1800. He served in the War of 1812 in the company commanded by Capt. Nicholas Cunningham (First reg't. of Ohio Vols.) under Col. Douglas McArthur. Volunteered June 18, 1812 in Fayette Co., O. Surrendered at Detroit, Mich. to Gen. Hull about Aug. 16, 1812 and remained prisoner till the close of the war. He lived in Wayne twp., Fayette Co., Ohio in 1820. Reported to have taught school there. Lived Union twp., Champaign Co., Ohio 1830-50. d. before 1860. Had one son and 1 dau. The son was probably the Samuel Hays of Fayette Co. in 1820 and of Union twp., Champaign Co., Ohio in 1850 who had sons Andrew, David and William.
